1/13/2011 -- No. 12 Southern Idaho (17-2, 3-1) earned a share of a three-way tie for first place in the Scenic West Athletic Conference, building a comfortable 59-24 halftime advantage then doubling up Colorado Northwestern in the second frame, 68-34, to trounce the Spartans (7-11, 0-4), 127-58, at home in Twin Falls. For the game, the Golden Eagles outshot CNCC from the field, 55.6% (50/90) to 35.5% (22/62), including a 13-of-26 (50%) to three-of-17 (17.6%) advantage from behind the arc. Southern Idaho put up 28 more shots from the field than the Spartans thanks in part to a 64-21 rebound edge, including 27 on the offensive end, leading to a 30-8 margin in second-chance points. Though CNCC only committed five more turnovers (20) than the Golden Eagles, the Spartans were in arrears 30-7 on points off turnovers. The contest's audience included 200 elementary school students who were given free admittance as part of CSI's Read Like an Eagle Program. Top performances:

Elsewhere in the SWAC, #19 North Idaho (16-3, 1-3) finally broke the ice in conference play, with an 87-52 rout of #25 Eastern Utah (14-4, 2-2) at home in Coeur d'Alene. The Cardinals never trailed, taking a 37-23 halftime advantage and continually growing the margin to the final difference.
